

Annual General Meeting

The association's Annual General Meeting took place in September 2018. Shareholders attending the AGM heard that the association's turnover for the year has decreased to over £5.07million (£5.39 million last year); this was partly due to the rent cut and the loss of a 10 year rent restructuring grant which had ended in 2017.

The Finance Director reported that the Operating costs are higher this year due to inflation and growth, although still within 2% of the 2015 cost levels.

He also noted that net fixed assets were at £33million (c.£65m gross value), with £1.9m spent on 16 properties purchased during the year and £600k spent on component replacements.

Shareholders were delighted to hear that the association had been through a formal IDA assessment and confirmed that Arawak Walton achieved the highest rating of a V1/G1.

The Chair highlighted that we have also expanded our office base this year. A Open Day event to enable stakeholders to see the new premises (see separate article) took place before the AGM was a great success. It was further noted that we now own and manage over 1,132 homes, 66 homes on behalf of Boaz Trust. She confirmed stock rationalisation opportunities via our partners which had enabled us to grow in line with our business plan objectives.

Thanks were given to the Staff, the Board, founder members, our partners, members of the Tenants Quality Panel and our lenders for their continued commitment and support.

Following our AGM in September, we are pleased to announce that we have officially appointed **Mr Robert Wakefield** onto our Board. Rob is the Chief Executive of Community Gateway Association (CGA), a housing association that owns and manages over 6,000 homes in Preston. Prior to joining the Board Rob's involvement with Arawak Walton began in 2014 when he became a co-opted Member of the Audit Committee.


