
#### Face-to-Face Windrush surgeries held at AWHA office's

In the wake of the 2018 'Windrush Scandal', a group of volunteers came together to support the Windrush generation and their descendants to apply for documents to prove their legal status and claim compensation. They were holding regular surgeries within the community until lockdown forced them to stop holding meetings face-to-face. It was vitally important to the team that these meetings were reconvened after lockdown.

Over the past few weeks, the meetings have been held at our offices in Ardwick every Thursday. We are so pleased we can do something to support this worthy project.

If you settled in the UK before 31st December 1988, you may be able to claim compensation if you suffered losses because you could not show that you had a right to live in the UK. Windrush Defenders can support you with this claim and could also assist with getting confirmation of your right to live, work or study in this country.

#### CHEETHAM HILL COMMUNITY ACTION DAY



On Thursday 26th August 2021, Arawak Walton in partnership with Buzz, NTCG, Mancunianway, Manchester City Council and MCLO held a community action day in Cheetham Hill.

The day was designed to be fun as well as helpful. A community skip was provided to assist tenants in removing bulky household items they wished to dispose of.

Colleagues from Customer Services and Housing Services were on hand to log any repairs and give general advice in relation to any tenancy related issues, as well as litter picking and a general clean up of the area.

There were a host of activities ranging from planting, children's prize giveaways and the local children also took part in an activity where they gave their views on the community and what they would like to see. Food was kindly provided by "Feed My City".

Residents were asked to complete feedback forms to tell us what things we could do to make the area better.

Reponses showed the key topics were:

- A community facility needed for the local youth as residents outlined that there is nowhere for them to go.
  - · Flytipping.
- · Environmental issues and security.
- · Focus needed on green spaced areas.

The day helped us to understand what some of our tenants would like to see from us and provided the opportunity for us to get into the community to engage with our tenants. It was a thoroughly enjoyable day!



#### IMPORTANT NOTICE TO UNIVERSAL CREDIT CLAIMANTS



In March 2020 a temporary £20 per week uplift was applied to Universal Credit Standard Allowance, to offer extra support during the coronavirus pandemic. This is due to be removed in September 2021.

The removal of the £20 uplift will not affect the housing element of your Universal Credit, however, if you think you are going to struggle to pay your rent once the change takes place, please speak to your Housing Officer now so that we can consider how best to support you. Your Housing Officer can undertake a review of your expenditure with you to identify savings and maximise your benefits.

If you are affected by the bedroom tax, you may be entitled to extra support via Discretionary Housing Payment. You can apply online here:

We are delighted to introduce Ashley Coleman! Our new Housing Assistant within the Communal Services Team, who has joined us via the KickStart programme.


