# **TENANT VOICES**

#### **ARAWAK'S OLDEST TENANT**

Mrs. Grant is officially Arawak Walton Housing Associations' oldest tenant, having turned 93 years old earlier this year. Having arrived in Manchester in 1959, Mrs Grant shares a story of hope, sadness and achievement in equal measure on how she came to live in Manchester. Still young at heart.

My early memories of being a child in Jamaica were being in church every Sunday, being the eldest of 8 children in a large loving family. Meal times were always a big deal and even today the smell of burning coal or wood always takes me back to meal times as a child.

10 years after Windrush had sailed, the British Government was still asking for people in Jamaica to come and work in England, with promises of jobs, housing and free medical care. I chose to join my then childhood sweetheart, Rupert who had travelled out a few months earlier.




I sailed on a Spanish ship, called SS Gigwana. It took 22 days and stopped off at various places like Tenerife and mainland Spain

before arriving at Southampton on 4 November 1959. I then travelled up to Moss Side in Manchester to meet Rupert. When I arrived I thought it was a city of factories, because of all the smog. You could not see 10 foot in front of you on some days. All the houses were joined up and it was bitterly cold.



The first few years were really hard, we were told that there were lots of jobs, plenty of houses and I thought everyone would be pleased to see us, but sadly this was not the case. We really struggled to rent a property to live in, with landlords openly putting signs up saying no blacks,

no Irish and no dogs. Unless you knew someone, jobs were hard to find, and generally we were treated very badly. But with perseverance we both got work, Rupert at Hyde Road bus depot and me at Bowaters in Trafford Park, saving enough money to get a deposit to buy a house.



When we returned to Manchester we decided that we would never put ourselves in that position again and chose to buy a house in Moss Side, in an area where we felt safe, free from persecution and where we could raise a family.

my husband feeling rejected and angry.

For over 50 years Moss Side was our home, often traveling back to Jamaica to see family and raising two beautiful children in a vibrant community. Unfortunately Mr Grant developed Dementia and needed intensive care, resulting in him moving into a care home, where he sadly passed away in early 2023.

I made the difficult decision to move into Bougainvillea Gardens, a scheme for older people because I had become isolated and felt lonely. Being one of 8 children and having lived in a vibrant community it was difficult to accept the silence. A decision I quickly realised was this right move. Although I miss my husband and my friends in Moss Side, Jackie, the scheme manager, has helped so much. She is so easy to talk to, and does everything to help us keep involved, like themed events and Bingo.

I am looking forward to Christmas and will reflect on my life with pride and hope any young people reading my story will not be put off their dreams to travel and see the world.





#### **CHEETHAM CULTURAL FESTIVAL**



Arawak Walton were delighted to support the Cheetham Hill Cultural festival this weekend. The Festival is in its 19th year, celebrates the diversity of the area, and is crucial to bringing together people from all ethnicities and faiths across Cheetham Hill. Community Centres and places of worship throw open their doors to welcome those who want to understand, want to learn more, and want to connect with others in their community that they may not otherwise have the opportunity to talk to.

Housing Services Manager, Tara Horner, attended. She enjoyed meeting Pakistani and Turkish community members and learning about traditional South Asian attire at the Guidance Hub's Family Fun Day. She made links with community partners Winning Hearts & Minds, watched performances at Manchester Jewish Museum, visited the Ukranian Cultural Centre and immersed herself in Sikh history and culture at Central Gurduwara.

# **WELFARE UPDATES**

### ARE YOU OUT OF WORK, OR OFF WORK DUE TO SICKNESS?



At Arawak Walton we understand that the cost-of-living crisis has caused many tenants financial difficulty. It has come to our attention that some tenants have been further impacted due to being out of work or off sick from work for a short period, and that not everyone is claiming all the support they would be entitled to.

You may think you aren't eligible for any support, but it doesn't take long to check, and you may be surprised!

You may also be entitled to discretionary housing payments, which can help to pay your rent.

#### CRIME PREVENTION AT CHRISTMAS



Christmas can be the most expensive time of the year, with some families saving all year round to make the festive period extra special. According to the insurance industry, statistically more home burglaries happen in December. Please find below some tips to keep your home safe.

Don't make it easy for opportunistic burglars. When you go out, or to bed, check you have shut and locked all windows and doors. Don't leave your keys in locks when you are in, as a burglar may be able to reach them through the letterbox.



#### PRETEND SOMEONE'S IN

Put lights on timers and leave the radio on to make it look and sound as if someone is at home or leave an ironing board up with a pile of clothes near the window.

#### **DON'T BE A SHOW OFF!**

Do not leave presents in full view of windows, even if they are empty boxes. Dispose of any boxes, and don't put large expensive packaging outside for everyone to see.

#### **HELP YOUR NEIGHBOURS**

If you or your neighbours are away for the festive period help each other by bringing in each other's bins. By leaving bins out for a matter of days, you are telling burglars that you are away.

### **CHRISTMAS RECIPES**

#### **CLASSIC EGGNOG**



Get into the festive spirit with eggnog, a classic Christmas drink made with brandy, cream, eggs and vanilla. Serve with plenty of ice in tumbler glasses.



#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 vanilla pod, split and seeds scraped out
- 4 eggs, separated
- 100ml sugar syrup
- 100ml double cream
- 500ml whole milk
- 100-150ml brandy
- Ice

#### **METHOD**

#### STEP 1

Put the vanilla seeds in a large bowl. Add the egg yolks and sugar syrup, and beat with an electric whisk until pale, about 2-3 mins. Add the cream, milk and brandy, and beat again until just combined. Strain into a punch bowl.

#### STEP 2

Clean the beaters, then beat the egg whites in a clean bowl to soft peaks. Fold a third of the whipped egg whites into the milk and cream mixture in the punch bowl, then add the remaining whipped egg whites. Gently fold these in until the eggnog is fluffy and smooth. Chill until ready to serve. Will keep, covered in the fridge, for up to a day. Just before serving, add plenty of ice, then stir gently and ladle into tumblers.

# Cariocca Enterprises Announces Next Cohort of its imPACT Internship Programme

Cariocca Enterprises, a Manchester-based workspace provider and founded in 1986 to support entrepreneurialism in Manchester's inner-city communities, manages over 200 workspaces in Miles Platting and Ardwick.

We are excited to announce the continuation of our commitment to empowering young people within our community through our "imPACT Programme." Following the success of its initial pilot for individuals aged 17 to 29, the second cohort is set to commence in January 2024.

This innovative Cariocca programme offers a unique opportunity for young people from ethnic minority backgrounds to acquire essential employment skills and gain valuable work experience across a variety of sectors including engineering, technology, finance, education, business, health, and public sectors.

Cleveland McCurdy, Chair of Cariocca said,

"Cariocca recognises the need for more young people in Greater Manchester to gain skills and experience in careers that would normally seem out of reach to them. The imPACT programme addresses this need and, where it can, provides muchneeded assistance to enable them to aspire to enter these professions."

Applicants accepted on the course will be provided with employability training, coaching, mentoring, CV writing, interview, and presentation skills, including talks from inspirational speakers, before taking up an internship with a partner organisation for up to two weeks.

Cariocca Enterprises funds this 8-week programme, including the cost of transport and lunches for those students that require assistance to and from the training centre or placement location.

Placements will take place on completion of the full training in March 2024 with our partners, including Greater Manchester Police, Manchester City Council, Arawak Walton Housing Association, and Manchester University NHS Foundation Trust.

Young people on the pilot programme felt that being part of the course had given them improved confidence in being more employable and provided them with opportunities they would not have otherwise been able to access, including meeting the Lord Mayor of the City of Manchester.






### **STAFF NEWS**
