In 1994, Arawak merged with Walton Housing Association to become Arawak Walton Housing Association. The association has grown and prospered over the years by offering an excellent, culturally sensitive and personal service to its very diverse residents.

#### We have 116 homes in Longsight.

Longsight is home to one of Manchester's most diverse communities and has an impressive 7 mosques. The area comes alive with the Muslim festival of Chaand every Autumn. Some famous people who lived in Longsight include Charles Halle, the painter Ford Maddox Brown and Danny Welbeck who played for Manchester United.

Today Longsight has its very own market and is described as the centre of its community, open every Tuesday to Saturday. Where you can buy everything from clothes to household items.

# MOSTON & HARPURHEY

We have 18 homes in Moston and 11 in Harpurhey

Over the next 2 years Manchester will see the largest ever regeneration project taking place in and around Moston & Harpurhey, which will see a new public square on Moston Lane, improved green spaces and more affordable housing.

Boggart Hole Clough situated between Harpurhey and Blackley is one of Manchester's 138 parks, that boasts an athletics track, a boating lake, cafe, a mini sports court and football pitches.

Harpurhey is also home to Manchester Youth Zone, a purpose built, state of the art, fully equipped youth centre which costs just 50p per session.

We are looking to increase our stock in the area and have already started investing in community projects like the Moston Amateur Boxing club and Moston Litter Pickers.

We work very closely with community groups to support and help the local community. Examples include The Mancunian Way, who help and support young people achieve their aspirations. Most of the referrals are done through the outreach work they do on the streets at night.


**OLD TRAFFORD** 

We have 60 homes in Old Trafford.

You will be surprised to know that for over a century there have been a steady stream of people from Africa, the Caribbean, Ireland, Turkey, Pakistan, India, and recently Poland and the Ukraine, making Old Trafford one of the most culturally diverse communities in Greater Manchester.

Trafford is where the Industrial Revolution began. During the early 19th Century, Manchester's rapid growth in the cotton industry led to the town's expansion, making it a hub for global manufacturing and trade.

Between 1948 and 1971 most of the Caribbean men and women who decided to settle in Manchester and the surrounding area found work in construction, at the Manchester docks, at Trafford Park, in factories, and as nurses in the newly founded NHS.

### VICTORIA PARK

Emmeline Pankhurst, Suffragette lived in Victoria Park.

We have 27 flats at Daisy Bank Court, which is an over 55's sheltered scheme, located in Victoria Park.

We own 4 Manchester based sheltered housing schemes which provide housing for tenants aged over 55's. We purchased Daisy Bank Court in 2013 and has since undergone extensive refurbishment works. To support tenants the building is equipped with a lift, communal lounge & dining room, laundry, guest facilities, where visitors can stay and a well maintained garden.

There is a Scheme Manager on site during office hours to assist tenants. Part of the scheme manager's role is arrange activities for tenants. Examples include coffee mornings, breakfast clubs, afternoon teas and trips out.

### **RUSHOLME**

Whitworth Art

#### We have 103 homes in Rusholme.

Rusholme is one of the most diverse wards, having a community with so many different backgrounds. A recent university study found that over 70 languages were spoken around Rusholme's Wilmslow Road, now popularly known as the 'Curry Mile'.

The area is also home to the Manchester Metropolitan University and the Whitworth Art Gallery, which receives over 400,000 visitors every year. In 2015, the art gallery reopened after £15 million was spent on renovating and increasing its exhibition spaces.



### **STOCKPORT**

We have 18 homes in total across Stockport.

Although we only have a small number of homes in Stockport it is very much seen as an area of growth. This is because In 2021, 7.3% of Stockport residents were identified as diverse. The 2.4 percentage-point change from 2011 was the largest increase among high-level ethnic groups in this area. Furthermore, there has been an increase in the number of tenants renting privately. In 2021, 14.4% of Stockport households rented privately. This figure increased from 11.4% in 2011, and compared to other areas has the highest rental price.

Did you know that the Stockport viaduct was built in 1840, has 27 arches and was made using 11 million bricks, at the time it was the largest brick structure in the world and today is a grade 2 listed building.

We have 59 homes in Moss Side.

With our roots in the African-Caribbean community, Moss Side was an obvious place to invest in, but not only in bricks and mortar. Arawak Walton continues the work of its founders by contributing to the local community by working with independent BME contractors, like Pommels, who carry out 100's of repairs to our homes every year. In 2023 £3.5m was recirculated back through local contractors within communities like Moss Side.

Every year we support local community Groups in Moss Side to deliver services to the community, examples include the Windrush celebration and the Moss Side Carnival.

#### We have 57 homes in Hulme

Hulme Crescents was a large housing development built in 1971 to replace the slum housing. However, they were considered a failure with chronic problems relating to damp, heating, pest infestation, crime, and health and safety. Between 1971 and 1993 a wealth of music was born from the crescents, including the Russell Club where Factory Records were born. Some of the bands included Joy Division, New Order, A Certain Ratio, Happy Mondays, Northside, and many more.

Today the landscape of Hulme has completely changed, in 1997 the Hulme bridge was opened by Sir Alex Ferguson, where the crescents stood are now spacious houses with gardens, some of which we own.

# MILES PLATTING

Miles Platting is home to our sheltered accommodation scheme: Sycamore Court.

Sycamore Court was built in 1983 and purchased from Anchor Homes in 2015. Shortly after purchase, the building was modernised and renovated. It contains 38 homes which are a mix of self-contained and studio apartments.

Our sheltered schemes have an on site scheme manager, who is available during office hours to assist tenants. The schemes focus on providing activities and opportunities for tenants to socialise in a supportive but independent environment. The schemes have a friendly and laid back feel, with low tenancy turnover with many long standing tenants.


**LEVENSHULME** 

We have 44 homes in Levenshulme which was once home to one of our founders, former Deputy Lord Lieutenant of Manchester and Anti-racism campaigner, Louise Da-Cocodia MBE.

Originally born in Jamaica, Louise moved to Britain in 1955 and trained as a nurse. However, having experienced and witnessed racism, Louise began to work tirelessley to combat racism and improve people's quality of life, both on a grassroots community level where she was affectionately known as 'Mrs D'; and on a more formal level.

She strove to promote equality of opportunity for Manchester's inner-city residents in housing, education and employment.

She co-founded and steered a number of community enterprise schemes, including the Louise Da-Cocodia Education Trust and Arawak Walton Housing Association. She was also a founder member of Moss Side and Hulme Women's Action Forum, the Agency for Economic Development in Manchester. Louise Da-Cocodia was one of the founding members of Arawak Walton, setting up the association in 1980. Louise Da-Cocodia lived in Levenshulme and worked tirelessly to champion the rights of black and minority groups in Manchester. In recognition for her outstanding work Louise Da-Cocodia received many awards but in 2005 was awarded an MBE for services to the people of Manchester.
